Our bi-monthly Church Meeting will be held in the Church on Thursday 27th July at 7.00 pm.

From Rev David Hill our preacher today:-

We are continuing to go through the sermon on the mount, and today we shall briefly look at the Lord's Prayer. When we pray these words we have no choice but recognise that this prayer is not our personal property, but it gives us guidance as to how we might pray. The most important thing is to **pray as we can.**

The prayer begins 'our', so we cannot stay as a solitary Christian. 'Our Father' does not mean God belongs to us. God is not ours to do with as we choose. God is not like *our* car, or *our* family, or *our* church. We cannot possess God.

In fact it is the other way round. God is our god because God has reached out to us. His love is the first step in our journey with this prayer. We are made for friendship with God. This is our default position. So we will begin our service with these words from a saint of old – Augustine, then we will sing "Great is thy Faithfulness", followed by which we will be encouraged to bring sentences of praise
