TODAY'S SERVICE:

An introduction by David Hill:

Take a deep breath, stand or sit – whichever your health appreciates – open your lungs, your mouth, your heart and for a major part of this service we will sing to His Glory. And today we may even sing more than normal! All of our songs have been chosen to encourage us in Praise and will appear on the screen in two main sections of singing. We all know that worship is far more than singing and many of us are unsure of the expression "time of worship" if it only involves songs, but worship in the Bible shows our hearts and voices should unite. So let us raise our vices and our hearts as we come in praise and thanksgiving.

In addition we will begin our service by using some words which date back centuries and sometimes referred to as the Sursum Corda. When I was a child and went to the local Chapel, these words were printed in the first page of the Hymn book, but were never ever used – because as some folk told me, "We don't use them because we just don't". Instead our hymn books were marked to a very select number of hymns that we sang week after week. Today we have such a wealth and variety of songs and liturgies that means we are spoilt for choice. Over the last few weeks you have graciously entered into orders of service which are different every time and for the next few months that is likely to continue as lay preachers and others will be conducting your services. I hope and pray your public worship will continue to be fresh and invigorating as we seek to give Him glory.
