DAILY PRAYERS

Sunday: Lord I lift Your name on high, Lord I love to sing Your praises I'm so glad You're in my life, I'm so glad You came to save us! You came from heaven to earth to show the way, from the earth to the cross, my debt to pay. From the cross to the grave, from the grave to the sky, Lord I lift Your name on high!

Monday: We pray for those people affected by the new volcanic eruption in Iceland, those that had had to be evacuated, and those helping the operations surrounding it.

Tuesday: As the Russia-Ukraine conflict deepens, and external powers are also involved on both sides, we pray that the honest efforts to bring about lasting peace will surpass any ongoing military developments.

Wednesday: Sing psalms, hymns, and sacred songs; sing to God with thanksgiving in your hearts. Everything you do or say, then, should be done in the name of the Lord Jesus, as you give thanks through him to God the Father.

Thursday: We pray for those in our country who live in the areas that are most vulnerable to bad weather in winter. We pray for safety from excessive winds, rains, snow and ice, and the support infrastructure will be in place where it is needed.

Friday: As we turn to our winter-time, we remember the parts of the world where it is summer, and where excessive heat brings the risk of drought and famine – particularly countries like Sudan where internal conflict is already causing severe hardship for many communities.

Saturday: We pray for Durrington Community Centre Church and others who are forced to move or merge with other congregations due to decreased numbers or funds – may God bless them as they continue to worship in another place.
